



Titanic and Liverpool: the untold story

Group Leader's information and introduction

This trail is designed so that students can gather their own information about the Titanic story and also discuss the various issues that it raises.

- The group will need to be split into four smaller groups, each to be supervised by an adult. Each group will then work in their own section of the exhibition, with one question sheet relevant to that area for the group to record their answers/ideas etc.
- The students will take on the role of pursers – these are the crew members who would be responsible for recording information and handling money on board ship.
- There is the opportunity for every student in the group to take a turn in recording the information should they so wish and the questions are both fact-finding and discussion based in nature.
- After each group has finished working in their particular area, they are then free to explore the rest of the exhibition although there would be no further worksheets needed.
- On your return to school, each group would then report back to the rest about the information they recorded so as to build up the complete picture of the Titanic story. This would also encourage discussion with the rest of the group on any points they found especially interesting.
- The four sections of the exhibition are as follows:
 - Group 1: Home Port and Olympic Class**
 - Group 2: The Voyage**
 - Group 3: 2 Hours 40 Minutes and Aftermath**
 - Group 4: Living On**
